

HASS Rubric: Pet Support Services

Does the organization have established partners that provide pet support services?

Beginner

The organization has identified potential connections with community partners that provide support services. Support may include food pantries, free or low-cost medical care, emergency or long-term boarding, pet-friendly housing assistance, behavior training, and more. Potential connections have been notated in an official format (document, spreadsheet).

Intermediate

The organization has initiated contact with at least one potential community partner that provides support services. Support may include food pantries, free or low-cost medical care, emergency or long-term boarding, pet-friendly housing assistance, behavior training, and more. Contact could be a direct email, submission of a request through the partner's website, phone call, in-person visit, or other.

Advanced

The organization has established a partnership with at least one community organization that provides support services. Support may include food pantries, free or low-cost medical care, emergency or long-term boarding, pet-friendly housing assistance, behavior training, and more. An established partnership should at a minimum include a signed agreement by both parties and clearly outlined expectations or expected results of the partnership.
